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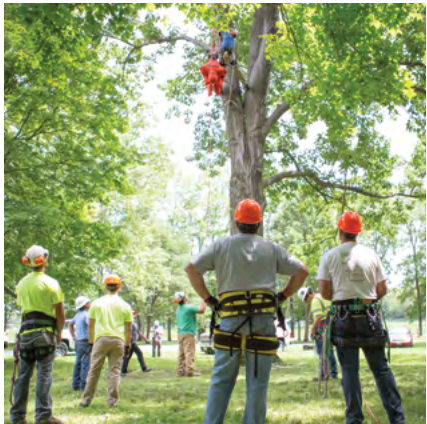
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What is ACRT Arborist Training?

5-day workshop — No fewer than 40 hours. International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are available if requested. This course is designed for individuals who seek professional tree care training and/or instruction on climbing with a rope and saddle. Class size is limited to 12. Instruction is both hands-on and in the classroom.

Prerequisites:

- Physical ability to climb using rope and saddle
- Minimal fear of heights
- Ability and willingness to follow directions
- Willingness to work outdoors in all weather
- Must be drug- and alcohol-free during training

Advanced Arborist

5-day workshop — No fewer than 40 hours, ISA CEUs if requested. This course is for those who have completed our Basic Arborist course or who have at least two years of on-the-job experience and some formal training. Class size is limited to 12. Instruction is both hands-on and in the classroom.

Prerequisites:

- Ability to climb to 20' with rope and saddle
- Ability to tie at least four basic knots
- Know and practice safe chainsaw techniques
- Some tree removal experience
- Some limb walking experience
- Basic knowledge of current ANSI Standards

- Compartmentalization Theory of Decay in Trees (CODIT)
- How to select appropriate tree species for specific sites
- Proper planting techniques
- Advanced roping and rigging techniques
- How to handle storm damage recovery

What is the Chainsaw Training course?



Chainsaw Training

2-Day Workshop — No fewer than 16 hours. This course is designed for individuals seeking instruction on how to properly use and care for a gasoline or battery-powered chainsaw and is ideal for homeowners looking for guidance or first responders who are required to use chainsaws in emergency situations.

Prerequisites:

- Physical ability to hold and control a chainsaw.
- Ability and willingness to follow directions.
- Willingness to work outdoors in all weather.
- Must be drug and alcohol-free during training.

What you will receive:

- ACRT Arborist Training certificate of completion
- ANSI Z133 Safety Standards
- A pass/fail grade

What you will learn:

- How to safely use chainsaws
- How to identify the parts and properly disassemble, clean, and reassemble the chainsaw

What is the Line Clearance Arborist Certification workshop?



Line Clearance Arborist Certification

4-day workshop — No fewer than 40 hours, ISA CEUs if requested.

This workshop is the only national line clearance certification program and the premier training program for line clearance techniques and safety in the U.S. Successful completion of this course satisfies OSHA's electrical safety training requirement for employers and employees.

It's designed for the tree worker whose person, tree or equipment comes within the 10' safety zone around energized wires.

ACRT Arborist Training certification as a Line Clearance Arborist or Line Clearance Arborist Trainee is issued upon satisfactory completion of the course.

Prerequisites:

- Two years of experience as a tree trimmer
- Ability to tie at least four basic knots
- Basic knowledge of ANSI Z133 Safety Standards
- Some knowledge of safe chainsaw techniques on the ground and in the tree
- Proof of CPR and first-aid training

What you will learn:

- To work safely in proximity to energized lines
- Tree growth patterns
- How a tree can be damaged and how to care for damaged trees
- The concept of directional pruning
- Current ANSI Z133 Tree Trimming Safety Standards
- Basic tree identification criteria

What is the Line Clearance Arborist Certification workshop? (Continued)

- Perform a successful work skills climb or work skills test using an aerial lift
- Tie 10 common knots used in tree care
- Pass a general knowledge classroom test

What you will receive:

What is the Electrical Hazard Certification workshop?



Electrical Hazard Training Certification

2-day workshop — No fewer than 16 hours, ISA CEUs if requested.

This course is offered by request. It's a presentation conducted by ACRT Arborist Training at our location or yours. It satisfies the requirements of OSHA 1910.331 and is designed for municipal, urban forestry or other tree care employees (whose work requires a 10-foot safety zone around energized wires).

This course is not for tree trimmers who perform line clearance tree trimming, tree removal in proximity to wires or brush clearing.

Prerequisites:

- Ability to climb to 20' with a rope and saddle or one year of experience in working from an aerial lift truck
- Proof of CPR and first-aid training

- Correct use of a chainsaw on the ground and aloft
- To tie 10 common knots used in tree care
- Correct pruning techniques in proximity to electrical hazards

What you will learn:

- To identify electrical hazards
- The concept of directional pruning
- Current requirements of the latest ANSI Standards
- To identify typical electric hardware and construction
- Correct use of a chainsaw on the ground and aloft
- Tie 10 common knots used in tree care
- Correct pruning techniques in proximity to electrical hazards

To pass, you must:

- Pass tests at the end of each chapter
- Perform a safe aerial rescue

Ohio Board of Career Colleges and Schools 3332-1-10-1 Uniform Refund Policy

If the student is not accepted into the training program, all monies paid by the student shall be refunded. Refunds for books, supplies and consumable fees shall be made in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code section 3332-1-10-1. Refunds for tuition and refundable fees shall be made in accordance with the following provisions as established by Ohio Administrative Code section 3332-1-10-1:

- 1) A student who withdraws before the first class and after the five-day cancellation period shall be obligated for the registration fee.
- 2) A student who starts class and withdraws before the academic term is 15% completed will be obligated for 25% of the tuition and refundable fees plus the registration fee.
- 3) A student who starts class and withdraws after the academic term is 15% complete but before the academic term is 25% completed will be obligated for 50% of the tuition and refundable fees plus the registration fee.
- 4) A student who starts class and withdraws after the academic term is 25% complete but before the academic term is 40% completed will be obligated for 75% of the tuition and refundable fees plus the registration fee.
- 5) A student who starts class and withdraws after the academic term is 40% completed will not be entitled to a refund of the tuition and fees.

The school shall make the appropriate refund within 30 days of the date the school is able to determine that a student has withdrawn or has been terminated from a program. Refunds shall be based upon the last date of a student's attendance or participation in an academic school activity.
